Bingo instructions

- 1) Each student is given a Bingo card.
- 2) Teacher gives students a word bank -

- 3) Students randomly fill in the Bingo sheet wth words from the word bank.
- 4) The teacher randomly calls on words OR uses the <u>Wheel of names</u> (click for link)
- 5) Students mark off the called words on their Bingo cards.
- 6) The game continues until a student achieves the specified winning pattern.



Remembering (Knowledge):



- Create a timeline of important events leading to Israel's independence.
- Write down five key facts about Israel's Independence Day.

Understanding (Comprehension):

- Describe why Israel's Independence Day is celebrated.
- Compare and contrast Israel's Independence Day celebrations with a national holiday from another country.

Applying (Application):



- Design a poster illustrating symbols associated with Israel's Independence Day (e.g., flag, menorah).
- Write a short paragraph explaining how people celebrate Israel's Independence Day in Israel and what traditions they follow.
- Create a simple recipe for a traditional Israeli dish that could be served during Independence Day celebrations.

Write a letter to a soldier



Brainstorm -

- What would it feel like to be away from your family and friends for months at a time?
- How would it feel to receive a happy letter from a nice and caring stranger?
- What would you do to stay positive and connected if you lived far away from your family?
- What are other ways you can show support to those who are serving our country?



- 1) Start with a salutation, such as "Dear Hero", "Dear Soldier"
- 2) Express your thanks for their selfless service.
- 3) Avoid politics completely and religion in excess; however, saying you are praying for them is wonderful.
- 4) Are you in your regular army service or reserves (מילואים)
- 5) Share a little about yourself: family, hobbies, work, school, pets, travel.

Israeli Inventions

Introduction (10 minutes):

- 1) Begin by asking students if they know any famous inventions. Write their responses on the board.
- 2) Ask students to make a list of inventions and discoveries by <u>Israeli</u> scientists and researchers, working locally or overseas.
- 3) Explain that Israel has developed many inventions that have had a global impact.
- 4) Show pictures or provide a handout with examples of Israeli inventions.

Examples of Israeli Inventions:

- USB flash drive (Dov Moran)
- Mobileye (Amnon Shashua)
- Waze (Uri Levine, Ehud Shabtai, Amir Shinar)
- PillCam (Given Imaging)
- Iron Dome (Rafael Advanced Defense Systems)
- Cherry tomato (Haim Rabinowitch)

Vocabulary (10 minutes):

- 1. Introduce and explain key vocabulary related to inventions (e.g., invention, inventor, innovation, technology).
- 2. Practice pronunciation and provide examples using the vocabulary in context.

<u>Main Activity (25 minutes) - 2 options:</u> <u>Option 1 My Invention</u>

- 1. Divide class into groups
- 2. In groups, brainstorm and list three inventions you find interesting. Think about how these inventions have impacted your lives or the world around you.
- 3. Writing a Paragraph -Choose one invention from your list and write a short paragraph about it. The paragraph should include:
 - A brief description of the invention.
 - The name of the inventor (if known).
 - How the invention has changed or improved people's lives.
- 4. Design Your Own Invention

You are now challenged to use your creativity and imagination to invent something new. Think about a problem you see in the world or a way to make people's lives better. Design and describe YOUR OWN invention in a paragraph. Draw your invention!

Option 2

- 1. Divide the class into small groups.
- 2. Provide each group with information about a different Israeli invention.
- 3. Instruct the groups to read about their assigned invention and prepare a short presentation.
- 4. Encourage them to discuss the significance of the invention, how it works, and its impact on society.
- 5. Allow time for groups to present their findings to the class.
- 6. Facilitate a class discussion after each presentation, encouraging students to ask questions and share their thoughts.

Wrap-up (10 minutes):

Review key points discussed during the presentations.

Ask students to reflect on what they learned about Israeli inventions.

Conclude by emphasizing the importance of innovation and creativity in society.
